Once the agreement is signed, which should occur by the end of the month, official notification to clubs/leagues will be provided.

Carol Cathcart extended thanks to BFNL Board, clubs, and staff for their tireless work during a difficult year. Given we will continue to experience various COVID-19 effects from some time, if any club assistance is required, clubs reminded to contact AFL CV via Carol Cathcart or Cameron Tomlins.

BFNL Board Chair extended thanks to the AFL Commission for ongoing work, whilst offering stable and strong leadership.

AFL CV I'm Committed Preseason Competition: Clubs to receive information outlining the finer details of the proposed structure in the next week or so, to seek interest of participation from all AFL CV clubs.

Premier Data update: Clubs (particularly senior coaches), were reminded to provide feedback on the webinar/presentation in late 2020, including interest in using the service.

BFNL reiterate such opportunities raise the standard and profile of the League. As a Major League, tools such as this differentiate us from other Leagues and act as an additional attraction for players.

Court Sweepers:

All clubs presented free court sweepers for their netball department, on behalf of Netball Victoria and Worksafe funding opportunities.

CHAIR'S REPORT



CAROL McKINSTRY - CHAIR, BENDIGO FOOTBALL NETBALL LEAGUE

Following on from the disappointment of the 2020 season, we had high hopes that football and netball would return in 2021, although played within COVID restrictions. While the start of the season was enthusiastically embraced by players and club supporters with large crowds turning out to watch and support their clubs, we encountered frequent challenges in the back half of the season.

The 2021 season was all about participation and the BFNL League Manager and Board had this as the major focus for the year. While we tried hard to have a normal season and then an abbreviated finals series, the lockdowns and COVID restrictions made that impossible. I would like to thank the club presidents and committees for their tireless work and goodwill as we sought to find ways to safely stage games. With high vaccination rates, we have optimism that 2022 will see more certainty around planning and having a season that has fewer disruptions. We are also looking forward to having interleague matches against the Ballarat Football Netball League and our netballers compete in the Association Games in 2022.

While completing a full season was not possible, the BFNL Board have continually looked strategically to position our league for the future, working with both clubs and the Central Victorian AFL Commission on a number of issues. We continue to advocate on behalf of clubs to ensure that there is a visible differentiation between the BFNL and other leagues in our region. We are continually looking for innovations that will improve the standard of competition and profile of the BFNL.

As in 2021, the BFNL Board continually monitored and considered the different financial environment both the League and BFNL clubs were operating in during this year. We reduced League fees for clubs and cut every possible cost. Again, we were fortunate that our past financial management enabled us to have reserves in place that we could use to get us through another difficult period.

Once again, I would like to particularly recognise and thank our League Manager Cameron Tomlins, for his tireless and exemplary work.



Cameron continued to meet every challenge in his usual professional and calm manner. Constantly problem-solving and working on various options occurred both before, during and post season.

I would also like to thank all our business and media partners for their support during these challenging times. Many thanks to our league naming rights partner, the Bendigo Bank for their long-standing support of our league. Their support of grassroots football is much appreciated as well.

Thanks also to Bendigo Mazda for their ongoing support of netball, Workforce XS, Harmac Homes, the Bendigo Club, Bart 'n' Print, AFS, SportsPower Bendigo, Coffee Storm, Cleanaway, Sherrin, Bendigo Party Hire, High St X-Ray, Great Ideas Awards and Gifts and Red Onion Creative for their valued support this year. We are fortunate to enjoy a very close relationship with our media partners (Bendigo Advertiser, Fresh FM, WIN TV, Nine News, Bendigo Times, Gold Central Victoria) who have continued to promote our league and clubs.

This year I would like to say a special thanks to Carol Cathcart who is stepping down as our Regional General Manager. Carol has also been our BFNL League Manager and the BFNL Board has valued the support she has provided to Cameron, the BFNL and our clubs. Her responsible financial management has never been more important than during the last two seasons. Many thanks also to the AFL CV Hub staff who have again worked tirelessly to get football and netball matches up and going.

Finally, I would like to thank all the BFNL Board Directors for their tireless commitment and considerable time this year. We are extremely fortunate the range of skills and experience across our Board. We look forward to a better 2022 where hopefully we will have vibrant competitions of football and netball, and also playing a significant role within our communities.

AFLCV REPORT



CAROL CATHCART - AFLCV REGIONAL GENERAL MANAGER

Season 2021 has proved to be challenging for all involved in Community Sport.

Thank you to the Leagues and Clubs along with players, coaches, officials, and volunteers, who are involved in football and netball clubs throughout the region for their patience, persistence, and contributions in a difficult season. Although frustrating at times and disappointing to see all finals cancelled due to COVID lockdowns, we are extremely grateful that competitive community sport returned in some form during 2021, bringing joy and relief to so many.

We welcome Central Murray Football Netball League and Golden Rivers Football Netball League as affiliates. When AFL Central Murray ceased to exist, the Central Rivers Board affiliated both Leagues with AFL Central Victoria in February. AFL Central Victoria established an office in Swan Hill to administer the Leagues.

The Central Victoria Australian Football Commission provided financial relief to Leagues with a reduction to Administration Fees for Season 2021 A further reduction for Leagues will also be applied in Season 2022.

After not playing in 2020, we used the slogan I'm Committed to encourage people to come back to their footy/netball in 2021. Many clubs supported the initiative by using the I'm Committed template or slogan when announcing new signings. This culminated in AFL CV conducting preseason games for both football and netball in seniors and juniors. Thanks to those who participated and based upon positive feedback we intend to conduct the preseason competitions again in 2022.

Once again, we brought the region together and began the year with our Expo, although this year it was delivered online. Topics covered included COVID Protocols, Club Sustainability Program, Themed Rounds, Sports Chaplaincy, and financial opportunities.

The Bendigo Bank have continued to support community football with over \$15,000 provided to Clubs for referring new business to the bank. We thank the bank for their sponsorship of our leagues and encourage all clubs to promote the referral program.

Congratulations to all concerned in both State and Local Governments and all clubs for driving facility development within the region. This year facility development has included: pavilion for Koondrook Barham, away and umpire change rooms and netball courts at Kangaroo Flat, netball courts and updated change rooms at Birchip Watchem, behind the goal netting at Macorna, lights and shelter at Eaglehawk, lights and umpire and netball change rooms at Bridgewater, lights at Inglewood, Huntly and Weeroona. Construction has commenced on the new pavilion at Harry Trott and on the development at Catherine McAuley College.

Thanks to AFL Victoria and Worksafe, their commitment to make clubs safer, have provided Nyah Nyah West United with funding towards new goal post padding.

Maryborough and Sea Lake both received a grant through the AFL Victoria Energy Safe funding to purchase new equipment to improve the safety of their canteen.

Colbinabbin, Donald Inglewood, Kangaroo Flat, Kerang Women, Maiden Gulley YCW, Marong, Mount Pleasant, Newbridge, Nyah Nyah West United, Pyramid Hill and South Bendigo were all recipients of the TAC Club Rewards Program.

Castlemaine Football Netball Club received funding through the SCIF grant to assist with the development of a skills program and having role models attend sessions to grow and support junior girls' football.

As a code, Australian Football continues to grow in our region. Our Development Managers, Daniel Reid and Jake McLean based in Bendigo and David Alderuccio based in Swan Hill, have worked hard to promote football across the region. They have provided many promotional activities, sporting school programs, school competition support and clinics both in schools and at clubs. Free clinics were provided to NCFL club Boort, to HDFNL club's Heathcote and North Bendigo and LVFNL club Inglewood.

David conducted a successful four-week program for girl's football which we hope will lead towards the introduction of a female competition in 2022.

A successful virtual Community Camp was conducted with the Richmond Football Club for primary and secondary students.

We had a large increase in Auskick numbers this year and look forward to them transitioning to junior football in coming years. New Auskick centres commenced in Axedale and White Hills, in addition to the Isamic Auskick centre, and East Loddon reintroduced their centre after being in recess.

Inclusion continued to be a focus for the Development Managers, with a series of clinics conducted at Kalianna. Congratulations to Kyneton FNC, forming a new team in 2021, joining the Bendigo Suns to participate in the Central Victoria Conference FIDA (Football Integration Development Association) Football League. The competition provides people with an intellectual disability the chance to play competition level Australian Rules Football.

AFL Victoria and AFL Central Victoria supported coach development with the Junior Roadshow and virtual webinars. A player to coach program was conducted for the Central Victoria Football League Women competition. Congratulations to the winners of the Coach AFL Coach of the Year Awards.

Although interrupted from time to time with lockdowns, the Football and Netball Academy programs continued. The BJFL were fortunate to play Ballarat in the Interleague Games but unfortunately the Gala Day was postponed on a couple of occasions and then had to be cancelled. Congratulations to players selected to participate in VLine Cup; this has been postponed to April 2021.

The AFL provided assistance for the Club Champions Program which allowed us to assign support to a number of clubs in a variety of areas including governance, finance, leadership, marketing and volunteerism. Many of our clubs will benefit from the development of a new club website

Our female numbers continue to rise with Kerang joining the Central Victorian Football League Women this year and the BJFL providing a complete competition pathway. AFL Victoria provided funding for two female advocates who assisted in developing our programs.

The BUA had umpires register in similar numbers to previous years. A successful new program targeting U/16 players to train as field umpires for the U/12s was introduced with 10 taking part in the inaugural year. Recruitment of boundary umpires within clubs resulting in 11 new boundary umpires for NCFL. Six umpires completed the mentoring program to transfer from boundary to field umpiring.

Thanks to Fosterville Goldmine for their support for netball umpires for the BFNL, HDFNL, LVFNL and NCNA. The support allowed AFL Central Victoria to provide umpires polo shirts to clubs, mentors for our umpires resulting in 10 C grade umpire badges, online workshop for club umpires and an introduction program for new umpires. We accredited 6 Intermediate Coaches and conducted a coaching workshop with Sue Hawkins focusing on attacking strategies.

AFL Central Victoria believe it has an important role in developing sport administrators/managers and have continued to host students from La Trobe University and SEDA to support the students' development and provide industry experience.

Thanks to Norm Sheahan, who resigned at the start of our year, for all his efforts to develop football within our region, but particularly with the BJFL and junior development.

Finally, we wish to recognise all staff at the Hub, they go above and beyond to assist our leagues and clubs. In what has been a particularly difficult year, they have remained positive and continually developed different scenarios in an effort to provide sport to their communities.

In what will be my final year, I would like to thank everyone for their support of me personally, and their contribution to football and netball. I have made many friendships and been made to feel welcome across the region. I look forward to seeing football and netball back in the community next year.

MANAGER'S REPORT



CAMERON TOMLINS - BFNL MANAGER

Mission Statement

"The Bendigo Football Netball League will provide a professionally administered league which is strong and vibrant. It prides itself on having a major competition status within regional Victoria. The Bendigo Football Netball League legacy is to leave the game and community in better shape for current and future generations."

A season of anticipation launched at Strathfieldsaye on Good Friday, in magnificent warm conditions akin to a final's atmosphere. Crowds turned out in force to welcome football and netball back after the global COVID-19 pandemic decimated the 2020 season, which ended in abandonment due to health concerns for the entire local community.

Six rounds into a largely uninterrupted 2021 season, there was growing positivity that the fabric of local football and netball clubs had returned, and community sport again resembled a level of post-COVID normality, with growing confidence completion of a full 2021 season was very achievable.

However, as we have come to accept, the situation again changed in an instant in late May. What ensued over the coming months were extended periods of frustration and uncertainty as the League and clubs were again required to pivot and demonstrate flexibility to work towards salvaging the remainder of the BFNL season as best as possible.

This season again demonstrated significant levels of resilience from players, clubs, volunteers, officials, spectators, and members, as the League and clubs worked tirelessly and remained patient, agile and flexible, aiming to understand and navigate the many changes and difficulties that presented community sport in general.

The ability of all those invested in the BFNL to remain focused and motivated to absorb the continual challenges is to be commended. Seasons 2020 and 2021 have been physically and mentally draining, but there is growing positivity the frustrating impacts of the COVID-19 global pandemic on community sport may now be largely behind us.



Most disappointingly, after significant efforts to pivot and demonstrate mid-season flexibility and patience, the ultimate result was a maximum of 1 competitive match playable after July 10, coupled with an inability to train for an extended period during late August to mid-September.

Without the provision of a clear return to competition plan by the State Government, along with ongoing local community health concerns, unavailability of players and volunteers under differing enforced lockdown restrictions, physical and mental concerns for players and several abandoned regular season rounds, the season was unfortunately again abandoned due to the COVID-19

Only days later, the Victorian Government confirmed the difficult decisions most leagues had already arrived at, declaring all outdoor community sport was not permitted to return to competition across Victoria until at least November 2021.

COVID-19 again disappointingly derailed any hope of a 2021 interleague campaign. However, the league remain committed to returning to interleague representative programs as soon as possible and safe to do so.

We were thankful however that our 17 & Under netball representative program was able to recommence during 2021, and congratulate and thank all selected players, coaches, and support staff for their

Our elite junior 17 & under netballers blitzed the competition in an undefeated win in the Echuca DNA tournament, before qualifying for the Netball Victoria Association Championships final, by completing the Regional Qualifier in Bendigo as runners-up.

Thanks to head coach Jayden Cowling, ably supported by Nicole Donnellon and Sharni McPherson for their leadership, coaching, and development of the league's brightest netball stars.

We are grateful we returned to competition for a reasonable portion of season 2021 and remain optimistic and excited to again return in 2022, with the belief that next season will return to a level of post-COVID normality that starts to closely resemble community sport as we remember it.

Not forgetting the friendly team at Bart 'n' Print who patiently and promptly provide the league and clubs printing and graphic design services during the season.

Summary

After a promising start, COVID-19 again had the final say on season 2021, however I am grateful we were able to take a step forward by retuning to competition for just over half a regular season. The uncertainty, frustration, and challenges that were again presented to leagues and clubs alike were significant. Yet again, the ability of our club volunteers, committees, players, officials, and supporters to adjust and absorb the additional requirements of following the outlined protocols from the State Government, AFL Victoria and Netball Victoria is to be applauded.

Our club Presidents again showed resilience under extreme pressure, providing leadership, patience and understanding to keep our players, volunteers, members, and sponsors active, engaged, and connected. In what is a difficult position to hold at the best of times, thanks for your effort and support during another incredibly challenging period for community sporting organisations.

To all BFNL clubs, thank you for your understanding and cooperation during these unprecedented circumstances. To operate a competitive and vibrant league, we rely on the professionalism and standards set by our local clubs. This is certainly not the way anybody wanted the season to end, however your patience and flexibility during frustrating circumstances is greatly appreciated.

Although slightly different to season 2020, we pass on a sincere thank you to all BFNL players, officials, supporters, and most of all volunteers for being a part of your club and donating your time and effort to your club. We could not operate without you, or your passion that drives your club and the League towards on and off field success. This pandemic will not go away in a hurry – we can only wish that season 2022 will play out to a conclusion.


