Maryborough FNC speak in favour of the proposal:

- Outline proposal for BFNL to convene a minimum of 3 formal 'General Meetings' of the BFNL annually, in addition to the AGM, for seasons 2022, 2023, 2024, 2025.
- Proposal to amend voting rights of all BFNL member clubs at such general meetings regarding question/s
- a. Offer example of potential future topic to trigger club voting rights, referencing BFNL consideration of presenting season 2021 individual awards tabled as an instance of the purpose of such amendment.

Gisborne FNC speak against the proposal:

- Role of BFNL Board similar to that of a club committee. Elected by members, with view to make decisions in the interests of and on behalf of the club.
- Concerned for management of league governance via consensus, and evidence of club self-interest in decision making processes.
- iii. All clubs already possess the ability to call a special general meeting which allow for voting provisions.
- iv. Such change in constitution is not warranted and not supported by the Gisborne FNC.
- Any amendment of wording within the Constitution must be considered a change to the Constitution.
- vi. BFNL Board are accountable and can be replaced, whilst Board vacancies currently exist for person/s who wish to nominate.

BFNL respond to the proposal:

- 30 days' notice period required for voting rights, amongst other formalities.
- Previously, BFNL didn't see a need to call general meetings prior to COVID-19, however clubs possess the ability to call a special general meeting.
- iii. Clubs need time to consult committees before being held accountable by way of vote at league meetings, which is the purpose of outlined notice periods.
- iv. Grievances received by the BFNL during 2021 were generally specific to fixturing, of which the BFNL possess decision making authority.
- v. Fixturing complexities aren't necessarily achievable by club vote, an independent Board should retain a key role in such decision making.

- vi. BFNL feel adequate consultation, engagement and feedback was sought during 2020-2021 to make critical COVID decisions, consensus difficult to achieve.
- vii. Unclear on the proposed process for determining the nature of future questions or matters which would be decided by way of club vote.
- viii. Regular BFNL procedure is to convene 3 'Presidents' meetings annually.

Mission Statement

The Bendigo Football Netball League legacy is to leave the game and community in better shape for current and future generations."

It has been a long, unique, and challenging journey across the past few years, however with a renewed sense of belief the worst of the prolonged COVID-19 pandemic is now behind us, we are incredibly grateful to complete the first entire BFNL season since 2019. When we crowned the champion teams on the final day of season 2019, we had no idea of the challenges community sport, and community in general, would face during the midst of a global pandemic.

It is terrific to again be able to congratulate all our Premiership teams on an incredible season, along with the hundreds of devoted support staff and volunteers on their tireless effort and dedication to season 2022. This season was built on the back of 2 years of interruption, disconnection, uncertainty, and frustration. It is a credit to all members of the BFNL who have remained loyal and patient, that we now return to competition for the most part in the way we all remember.

The Gisborne FNC broke their Senior football Premiership drought, by overcoming a perennially successful Strathfieldsaye Storm team in some of the dourest Grand Final weather conditions in living memory. Underlining the success of the Bulldogs 2022 campaign was the fact that all three football teams and three netball teams qualified for their respective Grand Finals — eventually including premierships to the Under 18 football, 17 & under netball, and A Reserve netball team's.

Shifting focus to the netball, the powerhouse Sandhurst A-Grade team created history achieving the incredible feat of 4 Premierships in a row in treacherous conditions. Such is the current brilliance of the Sandhurst netball program, 4 of 5 netball teams qualified for Grand Finals, for 3 Premierships (B-Reserve, B-Grade, and A-Grade). Congratulations to all Premiers, it was rewarding to reach the pinnacle of the season once again and crown our champion teams.

Another welcome return for season 2022 was our annual Michelsen Medal presentation ceremony. To be able to celebrate another successful season by recognising several outstanding individual performers in their respective competitions is a wonderful highlight for the League. The night ended in announcing two highly deserved winners of the highest individual honours in the BFNL, it was incredible to have a presentation season return in all its prestigious glory.

Congratulations to Jake Moorhead on his deserved Michelsen Medal win for a stellar season, whilst now dual-Betty Thompson medallist Madeline Stewart added the 2022 medal to sit alongside her 2018 victory, and dual Runner-up awards in 2016 and 2017. Both were popular winners amongst the wider BFNL community who have been proven consistent vote getters in previous years.

We congratulate the 2022 Ron Best Medallist Joel Brett from Golden Square, kicking 92-goals to claim the award named in honour of BFNL Hall of Fame and Legend inductee Ron Best, which was presented on the night by Ron's best mate and fellow inaugural BFNL Legend inductee Tony Southcombe. Brett finished agonisingly short of the magical 100 mark, eventually ending on 98-goals as his Golden Square team bowed out in a nail-biting Preliminary Final loss to Gisborne.

Thank you and congratulations to all our successful coaches and volunteers of our 2022 BFNL representative teams for committing to manage incredibly successful 2022 Netball Victoria Association Championship campaigns.

Thank you to every selected player for accepting the challenge to proudly represent the BFNL, whilst continuing your individual development at the highest possible level. Well done to both teams on making the Finals, and the Open team for finishing Runners-up.

We acknowledge all appointed coaches and players of BFNL 2022 netball representative teams. Jayden Cowling led the returning Open team which was unable to compete in 2019 due to VNL fixturing clashes, then missed during COVID affected seasons 2020-2021.

Nicole Donnellon and Sharni McPherson returned to co-coach the 17 & Under team; inspiring, developing and leading the league's brightest netball stars.

A successful representative program for both teams included the 17 & under netballers qualifying for the Netball Victoria Association Championships Finals following a successful qualifying tournament. The 17 & under team proudly represented the League against quality opposition at the Finals. Our Open team demonstrated the current calibre and strength of BFNL netball, narrowly edged out by Goulburn Valley in the overall Final to be crowned runners-up.

During the regular season, we proudly supported and hosted several valuable themed rounds, and we thank all associated organisations, foundations, individuals, and clubs for their support.

We are privileged to have an opportunity to use community football and netball as a platform to publicly support and raise awareness for important causes that ultimately have a positive impact on our local communities. - Historian Richard Jones for his regular amazing recollections relating to over 140-years of BFNL history.

Summary

The fabric and passion of community clubs, and their unique and irreplaceable value to our local communities has for the most-part returned. At times volunteering for and administering a club can be challenging and draining. Volunteers become stretched and tired yet front up each week because they love it. The value of a community football and netball club, and the associated social, mental, and physical benefits will not be taken for granted again.

We have a great relationship with the City of Greater Bendigo and surrounding Shire Councils and thank them for their cooperation and support to allow opportunities for the League and clubs to utilise local facilities. It is exciting that funding continues to be pledged to various facility upgrades, which is necessary as participation and usage requirements increase — particularly considering the continued growth of junior, girl's, and women's football competitions.

A huge thank you must be extended to BFNL Chair Carol McKinstry and the entire BFNL Board who are all skilled volunteers that donate and invest their time, effort, and support to the League, along with Craig Armstead and all staff members from AFL Central Victoria for their varied and amazing support and assistance provided during what is a long season. After 3-years of pressure and stress, the challenges faced by staff at times have been immense and overwhelming.

Finally, as mentioned it has been a long and tiring journey at times, but after now achieving a result in 2022, it is with enthusiasm and anticipation we prepare for season 2023. The worst of the global pandemic is now absolutely behind us, and I am convinced that BFNL participation, competitiveness, and general interest is at its highest level for many years. I firmly believe the league will continue to go from strength to strength as we confirm our status as the premier football and netball league in Central Victoria.

Again, the season was all about participation and even though we did have some matches impacted by COVID, forfeits were kept to a minimum. The regular season and then the finals series created much interest within our communities, and it was pleasing to see nearly all clubs participate in the finals series. Apart from the weather during the grand finals, we had enjoyed great games for netball and football with Gisborne taking out the senior football and Sandhurst winning their fourth grand final in a row in the A Grade netball. Congratulations to all premiers in both netball and football competitions.

This year saw the introduction of Premier Data statistics for football which was made available to clubs, the media, and supporters.



Along with a greater social media presence, this initiative raised the profile of our league and benefited our clubs, sponsors, and fans. Live streaming of a senior football match in each round was another initiative that raised the profile of the BFNL and clubs.

The BFNL Board and manager have worked hard to ensure financial stability and where possible, reduce financial burden on clubs. Congratulations to all football and netball best and fairest winners and especially to Maddie Stewart on winning the Betty Thompson Medal and Jake Moorhead on winning the Michelsen Medal. Congratulations also to Gisborne for winning the McCann Club Champion award.

I would like to thank the club presidents and committees for their tireless work and support throughout the season. Your patience in getting the season started with new software systems was very much appreciated. Many thanks also to the BUA who had challenges with COVID impacting the availability of umpires but worked hard to consistently supply our League with umpires.

The Year

Following significant interruptions during 2020 and 2021, undoubtedly the greatest highlight from 2022 was that we were able to complete a full home and away season of football and netball, and then enjoy exciting finals series. While COVID still had an impact with teams missing players, coaches and volunteers week to week, and club's having administrators unavailable, we were very impressed by the commitment and support of all clubs to ensure we completed the year.

Prior to the season every league prepared COVID Guidelines and Protocols to ensure awareness and clarity of how we would manage the challenges COVID presented, and these proved valuable throughout the course of the year.

Coming off the back of 2 difficult years we developed a "Play on 2022" marketing campaign. Various graphics were designed and used by AFL Central Vic, and every League and Club. This assisted us gaining exposure and momentum with the start of the season and continued throughout the year.

A concerning trend we saw throughout 2022 was unacceptable behaviour, especially on match days. Issues were noted at both junior and senior levels, with bad behaviour being demonstrated by club officials, spectators and players. While the behaviour was directed at varying people, the abuse towards umpires was particularly disturbing. This trend was seen across all competitions in country and metropolitan Victorian, and in fact across all sports. We are evaluating activities to address the issue in 2023.

As was the case in 2021, this year the Central Victoria Australian Football Commission provided financial relief to Leagues with a reduction to Administration Fees for the season 2021. It has been pleasing that AFL Central Vic has been able to provide this financial support and manage our finances to ensure deliver a satisfactory result for the year.

Congratulations

Completing a full season had many benefits and our congratulations go to all involved with teams who won premierships in 2022. Having no finals in 2020 nor 2021, this year was a good reminder how difficult it is to win a premiership, and we hope those who did have fond memories of their success.

Congratulations to all those who won individual awards in 2022 either at League or Club level. Where Leagues presented Club based awards, be they for on-field or off-field performance, we hope all people responsible were able to celebrate those wins.

Thank You

It takes so much work by so many volunteers to operate teams, clubs, competitions and leagues week to week, and complete the season. We specific wanted to say thank you to our important stakeholders:

- Thousands of volunteers enable our clubs to function and games to occur every weekend. So many people are required on match days to ensure games can be played and that all other requirements on game day occur.
- With over 400 matches played every weekend across netball, football and hockey, we have a heavy reliance on umpires. Umpiring all sports can challenging however they played a crucial role in our competitions. This year many umpires participated in multiple games on the same day and weekend to support those players and clubs.

It is also important to recognise and thank the many club-based supporters and officials who undertook umpiring duties where we did not have sufficient Umpire Association umpires to support those matches.

- AFL Central Victoria are fortunate to have a large portfolio of organisations who partner with us, and our Leagues and Clubs. These partners deliver support and benefits through a range of initiatives and activities. Our community sport has a significant footprint across Central Victoria, and through this network our partners are able to deliver benefits to local communities and to their organisations. The contribution of these partners ultimately allows AFL Central Vic to maintain our fees as low as we possibly can, and ensure our sports are affordable. A special mention to our Major Partner, Bendigo Bank, who are also a major partner of the BFNL, BJFL, BUA, CVFL, LVFNL, HDFNL, NCFL & AFL CV Academy. The Bendigo Bank have continued to support community football with over \$7,000 provided to Clubs for referring new business to the bank. We thank the bank for their sponsorship of our leagues and encourage all clubs to promote the referral program. We also enjoy 4 community partners - TAC, Headspace Bendigo, Love the Game, and the Pat Cronin Foundation.
- Tribunals are a necessary and important of all sports. In both Bendigo and Swan Hill, we have a group of volunteers who give their time to fulfill this function. It can be a difficult process and environment and the time and expertise they provide is much appreciated.
- In our local communities, the media are an important source
 of information. That is certainly the case for community
 sport. Thank you to staff at all of the newspapers, radio and
 television stations who provided content to promote, preview
 and review our competitions and those who participate. A
 special mention to those who delivered live broadcasts.

Floods

While not occurring until the completion of our seasons, the recent floods have had a massive impact on individuals, families, property, sports clubs and communities across the AFL Central Victoria geography. At the time of writing many areas and communities are still at risk and we hope for positive outcomes. We have all been impressed with the way individuals and communities have come together to help each other.

AFL Central Vic have been working to provide assistance where possible. Our focus has been predominantly with information and assistance on funding available to assist affected clubs. We have worked with the AFL who have already provided cash directly to 5 clubs in our region.

In 2022 we have seen some new and existing programs being delivered with some fantastic results:

- NAB Auskick Program
- AFL Primary Play Programs (free AFL program delivered to primary schools)
- AFL Kinda Play Programs (free AFL program delivered to kindergartens)
- Footy4Fun
- Junior X and AFL 9's

In Bendigo and surrounding regions, the program was delivered to 146 Schools between term 1 and 3 reaching over 100 schools in term 2 which was the highest in the state. In Swan Hill and surrounding regions, the program was delivered to 67 schools. In Term 4 Central Victoria have attended 25 Kindergartens delivering the new Kinda Play program.

Conducting these programs enabled AFL Victoria to promote NAB AFL Auskick and Community Football to transition participants into community leagues and clubs.

Across the region we also ran several Footy4Fun programs focusing on come and try, especially for girls and inclusion for everyone. This was a great success seeing new participants registering. With the success of the Footy4 Fun Girls programs we have seen new female community competitions start which was a huge success across the region enabling new teams and pathways form.

The Junior X program has been a huge success in Bendigo running an 8-week competition with over 80 junior boys and girls participating. We aim to run a modified competition in Swan Hill in early 2023. The aim of Junior X is a short format game, focused on development, fun and enjoyment. This is a social aspect of the game which is played outside our traditional season.

Development & Pathways

An uninterrupted year enable AFL Central Vic to provide a full year of football and netball academies in Bendigo and Swan Hill. It was fantastic to see young athletes able to participate in these programs and develop a range of skills. Similarly, the academies provide a great pathway for coaches who are looking to learn and develop.

AFL Central Vic junior football teams played representative games in Ballarat against their junior teams, and also against Goulburn Murray Junior League at Strathfieldsaye. Our Central Vic Football League senior women's team played high quality football in a representative match against Northern Country Women's League at the QEO.

All leagues in our region had interleague netball teams who attended tournaments along with association championships. This included age groups form 13 and under right through to open age. The netball academy players participated in a tournament in Melbourne.

This year saw two V/Line Cup carnivals for our best under 15 female and male players. Both carnivals were held in Shepparton across the most talented under 15 players across all areas of country Victoria.

The 2022 V/Line Cup was held in the regular time period of September, with 2 boys' teams and 1 girls team competing. Unfortunately, the 2021 V/Line Cup did not occur due to COVID, with the carnival being held over until April 2022 school holidays. It was great to see these players demonstrate their skills. Thanks to the coaches and other volunteers who made both events a success.

During the year we held gala days where junior footballers and netballers from the various leagues in our region where able to come to one location and compete against each other.

Across both netball and football, AFL Central Vic provided multiple programs and activities for the education and development of coaches and umpires. These programs involved on court/field and classroom formats for delivery and were facilitated by very well credentialled presenters.

Infrastructure

Congratulations to all concerned in both State and Local Governments and all clubs for driving facility development within the region. This year facility development has included: major pavilion development at Harry Trott oval in Kennington featuring new change and social rooms and landscaping, major development at Lord Nelson Park in St Arnaud featuring new change rooms for football, netball and hockey, and new pavilion, and player and umpire change room upgrades at various clubs. Construction is well advanced on the major development at Catherine McAuley College in Junortoun.

A major upgrade at Donaldson Park in Wedderburn has commenced which will include new facilities and unisex change rooms for players and umpires.

Finally, we wish to recognise all staff at the hubs, both in Bendigo and Swan Hill. They go above and beyond to deliver high quality competitions and assist our leagues and clubs. Specific thanks to Sam Skinner, Jake McLean and Daniel Reid who finished working with AFL Central Vic and AFL Vic during the course of the year for their contributions.

In what was my first year in the role, I would like to thank everyone for their support of me personally, and their contribution to football and netball. As with anybody new to a position it takes time to learn, and everybody has been very patient and made feel welcome across the region. I look forward to seeing more football, netball and hockey next year.

After getting two wins against rivals, Maryborough, it was Eaglehawk at the Camp Reserve that haunted the group moving forward, falling agonisingly close to the Borough by a lonely one-point loss.

With one of the highest profile netball recruits the League has seen, Fiona Fowler joined the Magpies to co-coach alongside Gary Cooke. Fowler is a former Suncorp Super Netball (SSN) player, a Scottish International having played at dual World Cup and Commonwealth Games.

Alongside her was Cooke, a former Men's State representative and Victorian Netball League (VNL) coach, with the pair guiding the clubs return to A Grade netball for the first time in several years. And for the first time in the clubs history, A Grade and A Reserve made the finals in the same year.

With several local players returning to the club, and joined by some high profile recruits, the club instilled a strong work ethic into its players, which translated into on-court results.

Off court, there was a move to a more professional club, with the administration and management working together and guiding the club out of its past and looking towards the future




Reserves Coach Jamie Hogan coached during 2022 for the final time, with GSFNC the benefactor of coaching our club over many years.





Best of luck to all, Go the Mighty Storm.










GRAND FINAL MEDALS



NALDER MEDAL

The Nalder Medal is presented to the best player on the ground in the first eighteen grand final.

It is named of Alan Nalder a former South Bendigo and Kennington player. Alan played for South Bendigo during the McDonald Era and moved on to Kennington where he coached them to their only premiership in 1956.

A very talented on-baller, he was tragically killed in an accident on the way home from Benalla at the young age of 32.

The Golden City Football League named the league senior best and fairest award in his memory.

When the Bendigo and Golden City leagues combined they initially kept two divisions, but in 1983 the League became one division.

At that point the league decided to continue his memory by recognising the best player on the ground in the grand final.



TURNER MEDAL

For anyone who grew up in Bendigo the name of Roy Francis "Dick" Turner was well known and respected.

Dick was the truant officer in Bendigo and many young students got to know Dick well.

Passionate about his community he served on council for 17 years and wore the mayoral robes on three occasions.

His true love was the Golden Square Football Club and he is credited with giving the boys from Country Vet Oval the Bulldog as its emblem.

He called football on 3BO for over 30 years and was Chairman of the newly formed Bendigo Football League before standing down due to ill health.

A bust of Dick sits in Golden Square keeping an eye on his favorite part of town.



ASHMAN MEDAL

Linking the best player on the ground for the Under 18 competition to Rod Ashman is a perfect fit.

An outstanding junior for Eaglehawk he won the Symons Medal for the Best & Fairest of the Bendigo Football League in 1971.

Making his name initially as a goal-kicker his size saw him move to on-ball roles. Carlton saw something in him at a young age and he went on to become one of Carlton's great players in their great era. He finished with 236 games and 370 goals and had premiership medallions from 1981 and 1982.

His service was recognised by being inducted into both the Carlton Hall of Fame and their Team of the Century. In 2007 he became player welfare officer at Carlton.
