While we are slightly beyond the official halfway point of the 2026 season, our annual mid-season bye that aligns with school holidays was a great opportunity to rest and reset for the final push towards Finals.

Last week we announced that the League will be conducting a trial of club-hosted finals during the 2026 finals series.

Under this trial, two clubs will have the opportunity to host Week 1 of our BFNL Finals Series on 29 & 30 August with host clubs selected using a set of minimum requirements that make them a viable host for an event such as a BFNL Final.

The final schedule of Week 1 of our BFNL Finals Series will be determined as early as possible with hosts selected using the Senior Football standings in alignment with the A-Grade Netball standings. A club is unable to host a home Senior Football Final.

The trial aims to:

- Provide BFNL clubs with an opportunity to generate additional revenue through hosting rights.
- Enhance the finals experience for participants and supporters.
- Increase community engagement and attendance at finals matches.
- Showcase the quality of facilities and volunteers across the BFNL.
- Strengthen the connection between finals football and netball and the broader BFNL community.

The Queen Elizabeth Oval remains as the premier ground in the region and it will continue to host weeks two, three & four of the 2026 BFNL Finals Series.

TAC Club Rewards

The 2026 TAC Club Rewards Program is fully live and operational, with applications now open via 'smartygrants'.



Clubs can apply via the code.

The program has contributed more than \$3M to clubs around the state since 2021. Once again, the program will encourage clubs to take the lead in promoting road safety within their communities, with the reward of up to \$10,000. Full criteria available in the PDF attached.

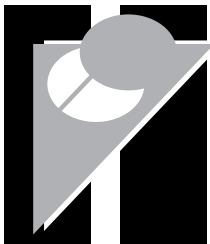

The clash between Strathfieldsaye and Gisborne highlights round 12 in Bendigo Bank Bendigo FNL senior footy.

It's third against first on Storm's turf at Triple M Park as the season resumes after a bye.

Since a 35-point loss at Gisborne in round three, Strathfieldsaye has gone on an eight-match winning streak.

Storm's surge includes wins at Eaglehawk, seven points; against Sandhurst on the QEO by 19 points; and on South Bendigo's Harry Trott Oval by 27 points.

There have been many contributors for the Jeff Andrews-coached Storm.

Players to watch for Strathfieldsaye include Daniel Clohesy, Hunter Lawrence, Drew Lloyd, Tyson McKenzie, Darcy and Riley Mulquiny, James

Schischka and Siologa Siu.

A premiersip-winning player with Storm in 2019, Sam Heavyside was in for his first senior game of the season last round.

The experience of Heavyside, Ben Lester, Patrick Blandford and Kya Lanfranchi is a huge plus for Strathfieldsaye.

A major threat to Storm's chances will be Gisborne full-forward Pat McKenna who kicked 10 goals in the win against South Bendigo.

A powerful attack for the Bulldogs includes Shane Clough and Jed Denahy.

Key players for the Rob Waters-coached Gisborne include ruck-rover Brad Bernacki, captain and key defender Zach Vescovi, ruckman Boyd Nalder, Adam Brancatisano, Dylan Johnstone, Thomas Werner and Kobe Zerafa.

Another important match will be at Harry Trott Oval in Kennington where South Bendigo takes on Castlemaine.

Defeat in its past two matches to Strathfieldsaye and Gisborne has put South Bendigo on the fourth rung.

A Bloods' line-up coached by Troy Coates, non-playing, and Jack Fallon, playing, will be desperate to bank the points.

In round three South Bendigo led 43-8 at quarter-time of the clash at Castlemaine's Camp Reserve on the way to a six-goal victory.

Key players for South Bendigo include on-baller/mids Coen Harker and Brody Haddow, Brock Harvey in attack, ruckman Callum Crisp, Anthony Zimmerman, Ollie Turnbull, and co-captains Zac Hare and Josh Nitschke.

A five-five record has Castlemaine in sixth place.

The Bailey Henderson-coached Magpies are level on 20 points with reigning premier Eaglehawk, but 13 per cent adrift of the Two Blues.

Castlemaine has played well to beat teams below it, but none above it on the ladder.

Best in an 11-goal win at home against Kangaroo Flat last round were Callum McConachy, Jaise Coleman, talented forward Zack Derksen, and

The Magpies' squad includes Brodie Byrne, Ashton Frankling, Will Marks, Darby Semmens, Hunter Staples and John Watson.

Kangaroo Flat is back on its turf at Bendigo Mazda Oval in Dower Park to play Eaglehawk.

The Roos welcomed back co-captain and gun on-baller Ethan Roberts for his first senior game since the round one match at Gisborne to tackle Castlemaine.

Key players for the Tyrone Downie-coached Roos include Tyran Farmer, Nick Keogh, Nick Lang, Josh Leersen, Aaron Nevins and Kyle Symons.

A highlight of this contest will be in the ruck where Kangaroo Flat gun Angus Macpherson takes on Callum Heath.

Eaglehawk beat the Roos by 39 points at C and M Oval in Canterbury Park in round three.

The Hawks' charge in that match was led by Joel Mullen, Ben Thompson, and Michelsen medallists Noah Wheeler and Billy Evans.

Latest hit-out for Eaglehawk was at home where it beat Golden Square by 17 goals.

Players to watch for the Borough include Jacquin

Mifsud, Lewin Davis and Jack O'Shannessy in defence, wingman Oscar White, and Charlie Langford and Jonty Neaves in defence.

Golden Square is back at Gourmet Pantry Oval in Wade Street to play Broadford.

In round four the Bulldogs won at Broadford's Harley Hammond Reserve by 122 points.

The Golden Square team coached by Brad Eaton, non-playing, and Liam Barrett, playing, will be keen to hit back after a disappointing performance against Eaglehawk a fortnight ago.

Key players in the blue and gold include Jordan Rosengren, Tom Strauch, Harry Burke, Noah Warfe, ruckman Liam Hoy, and Jack Stewart.

Been a tough first season for Broadford in the Bendigo FNL.

The Kangaroos knew it would not be easy after a two-year recess on the footy front.

Best for the Nathan Thompson-coached Broadford in the latest hit-out with Sandhurst were Taiten Thomas, Jay Eager, Louis Thompson, CJ Brill, Harry Behan and Toby Hope.

Sandhurst has the bye.

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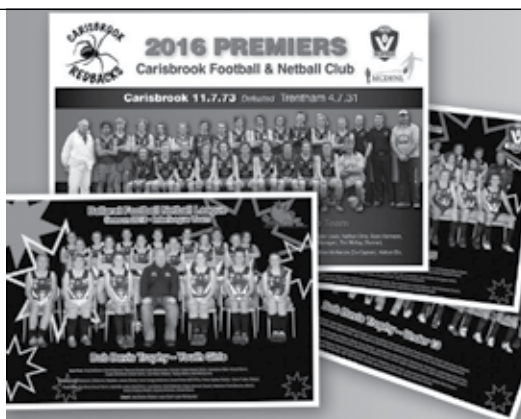

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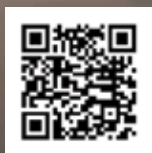
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Reflections...

Square Hall of Famers from 2019 Induction

I'd bet it's safe to say most central Victorian sports followers know the names of Golden Square FNC stars Ron Best Tony Southcombe Garry Mountjoy Peter Moroni and more recent top performers such as Simon Rosa and Christian Carter.

But how many recall the achievements of Vin Lapsley and netball icon Karen Erwin?

Today I'll concentrate on their achievements and records and in a future article fellow Square Famers Richie Lee and Carl Rohde.

Vin started his Square career in the under-21s in 1938 and when he graduated to the senior side he became a fixture in the back half's defensive six.

But of course World War 2 interrupted all life, not just footy, although Lappo played in Square's under-21 1942 premiership side.

Three seasons later Lappo was a standout member of Square's 1945 BFL premiership side which thrashed Eaglehawk in the grand final: 23.20 (158) to 8.9 (57).

To make that season even sweeter Lapsley won Square's senior fairest and best club award.

In 1950 Vin again won Square's club fairest and best award in a season where Golden Square's official guernsey was royal blue with a gold sash and in 1955 made it a treble with another award.

Lappo was an imposing figure on the ground. He had slicked back hair, parted in the middle, and was one of the best drop kicks in the BFL.

Radio commentator --- the late, great Dick Turner --- described Lapsley's style as "containing perhaps the greatest drop kick in the league which

belongs to the station officer of the Bendigo Fire Brigade.

"Lappo could drop kick the ball virtually to the centre of the ground he was playing at each Saturday. And he did that almost every time," Turner said.

By late 1954 Vin took over as caretaker-coach after Norm McDonald departed before the close of that season and one scribe described his role as "not taking a backward step off or on the field, exactly like his playing style."

He played the last of his 227 senior games ---- a stat which stood as a club record for two decades --- in 1957.

And perhaps true to form in that last game, which was his testimonial game, Lappo fired up. Unhappy with a couple of umpiring decisions which went against him concerning his spoiling tactics, Lappo exploded with some expletives and then walked off the ground, mid-match.

That was that. Nonetheless, he was awarded GSFC life membership in 1954 and was a proud member of the BFL 200 game club.

He passed away in August 2005 and I remember standing with other footy scribes under a shop awning directly opposite the Square Fire Station as Vin's funeral cortege left the building and the area around it, and proceeded down High Street.

Netball was introduced into the BFL fixture in 1991 causing the new name "BFNL" to come into being and Golden Square was the dominant force in the inaugural season.

The Bulldogs won the very first A grade premiership and quickly became the powerhouse

of the competition thanks overwhelmingly to the efforts of Karen Erwin.

During her tenure at the club she was known as Karen Leahy but she reverted to her maiden name, hence Karen Erwin features in Square's history.

She'd been a top netballer in Melbourne, but when she moved to Bendigo after purchasing a sports store here Karen reverted to her maiden name.

Her work ethic in not only coaching but also in developing the code after founding the netball component of Golden Square FNC is integral to her installation as a Hall of Fame member.

And she had to cope with no netball court at the Wade Street precinct until 1997 with the Square's netball teams playing home games at the Maple Street Primary School's courts.

Karen was captain-coach of the A grade side which won the premiership in netball's inaugural 1991 season with victory over Sandhurst. She received great support in that momentous season from A grade team manager Rick Stearns.

She was again captain-coach of the A grade team in 1992 which finished runner-up to Kangaroo Flat and additionally Karen coached the B grade team which won the flag with a win over Eaglehawk.

In 1993 with Karen again in charge Square's A grade side won their second premiership with a 40-27 victory, again over Eaglehawk.

And in the five years of her netball involvement at Wade Street Karen coached the club into five grand finals winning two A grade flags, a B grade premiership plus a night competition premiership as well.

Apart from her coaching attributes Karen possessed great prowess as a player. She primarily played Centre but often swapped into goal attack.

Square teammates praised her great aerobic capacity allied to her super competitive skills. Karen won the club A grade fairest and best award in 1991, 1993, 1994 and 1995 and narrowly went down in the BFNL's A grade Betty Thompson fairest and best medal count twice.

Overall she played 108 games for the Bulldogs and was named in Fresh-FM's All Star netball side each year she played for the Square.

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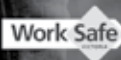

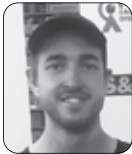
